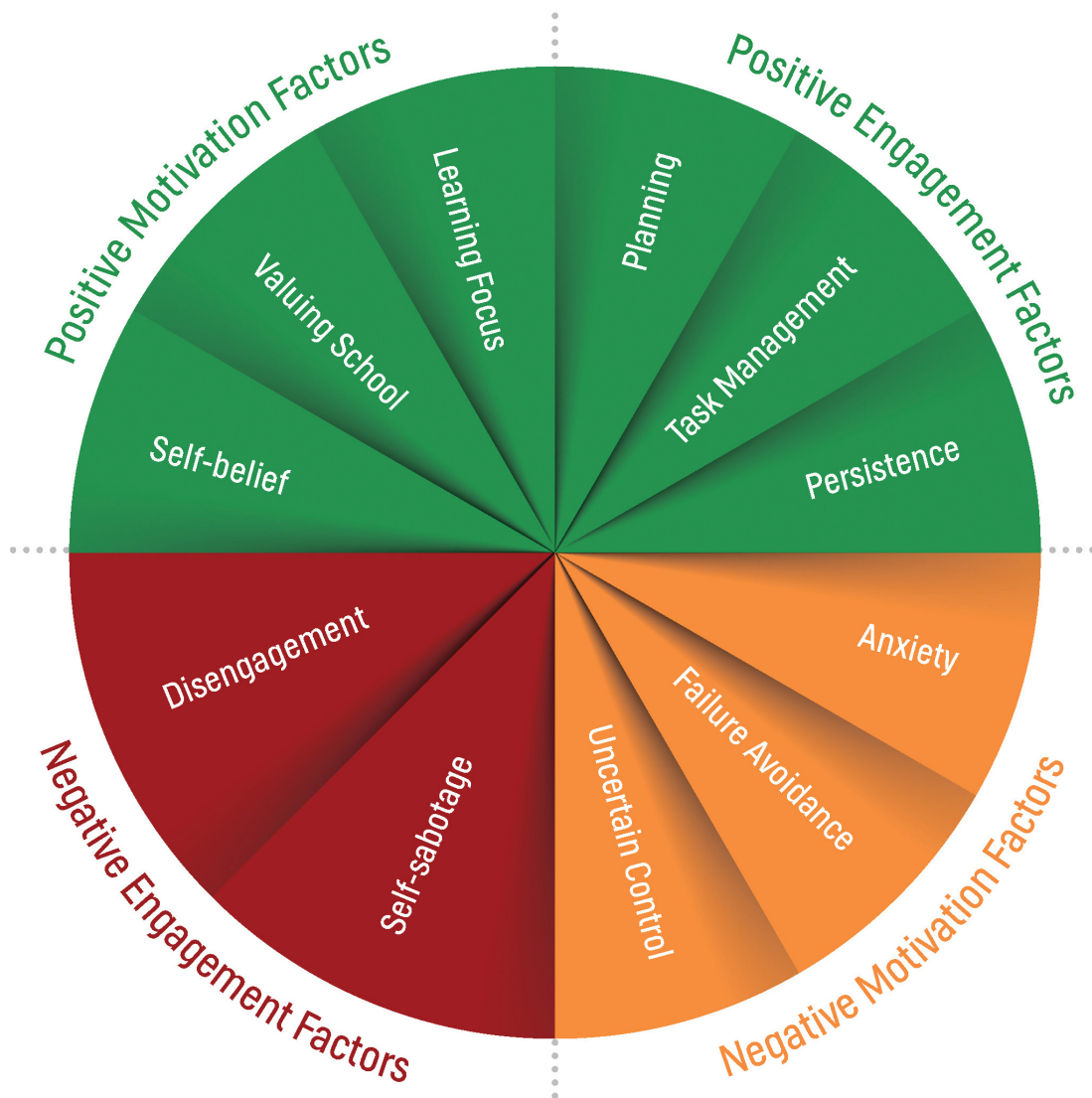

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Trinity Grammar School was founded in 1913 by the Rector – Rev G A Chambers (later Bishop of Central Tanganyika) – and the parishioners of Holy Trinity Anglican Church Dulwich Hill as a boys' day and boarding school. In 1928 it became a School of the Anglican Diocese of Sydney. Its School Council is appointed by ordinance of the Synod and the Archbishop of Sydney is its President.

The School was established with 29 students, aged from 6 to 16 years, in a large house in The Boulevard, Dulwich Hill, with the boarders residing on site. Within six months the increase in pupils caused the School to move to larger premises in the same street.

In 1926, the School acquired the present campus (formerly Hurlstone Agricultural High School) at Summer Hill, set on 6.8 hectares of land, and shortly after, the property 'Llandilo' at Strathfield.

From 1932 the Preparatory School was established as an infants and primary school at the Strathfield campus and the Secondary School students occupied the Summer Hill site.

In 2000 an additional primary school was established at Summer Hill – the Junior School. A PreK-Year 2 school was established in leased facilities at Lewisham from 2006 until 2012. Over the next few years the students from the Lewisham campus were transitioned to both the Preparatory and Junior Schools. Since 2015, the Junior School has been a K-6 environment with all Pre-Kindergarten classes operating at the Preparatory School.

In 2016 the School opened a new Field Studies Centre at Woollamia in the Shoalhaven region. This replaced the School's previous Outdoor Education Centre at Pine Bluff near Bigga, NSW, which operated from 1993-2014.

The School is one of the original members of the Combined Associated Schools (CAS) in New South Wales, founded in 1929. The other members of the CAS are Barker College, Cranbrook School, Knox Grammar, St Aloysius' College and Waverley College.

Trinity Grammar School consists of the Senior and Middle School for Year 7-12 students, the Junior School (K to Year 6) and the Preparatory School (Pre-K to Year 6). It currently has over 2100 pupils across its campuses.

A SAFE LEARNING & WORKING ENVIRONMENT

INTRODUCTION

Trinity Grammar School is committed to providing all members of the Trinity community with a learning and working environment which is safe, supportive and caring, and which is free of harassment and discrimination of any kind. Harassment and discrimination will not be tolerated under any circumstances. The School expects everyone who is part of the School community – students, parents and staff – to honour the School's commitment in this regard and to work with the School in establishing a safe learning and working environment.

DEFINITIONS

Harassment includes bullying and sexual harassment. It involves physical, verbal or psychological behaviour which makes another person feel embarrassed, offended, upset, devalued, degraded, afraid, frustrated or angry. **Bullying** is a form of harassment which involves repeated intimidation, over time, of a less powerful person by a more powerful person or group of people. **Sexual harassment** refers to unwelcome contact or advances of a sexual nature.

Examples of harassment include:

- hiding, damaging, destroying or stealing others' belongings;
- name calling, putting a person down, teasing, pulling faces, using abusive language;
- hitting, pushing, pinching or threatening;
- deliberately excluding a person;
- insulting, demeaning, humiliating, offensive, vilifying or intimidatory behaviour, or behaviour which incites hatred;
- making comments about a person's sexuality;
- showing material of a sexual nature;
- whistling, gesturing or making comments that are sexually explicit and offensive;
- behaviour which is unwelcome, unreciprocated and uninvited.

Discrimination refers to any behaviour or practice which reflects an assumption of superiority of one group over another or which discriminates on the basis of a real or perceived membership of a particular group. Examples include discrimination on account of a person's gender, religion, intellectual or physical ability, culture, race or background. Examples of discrimination include:

- asking discriminatory questions;
- making offensive comments or gestures, telling offensive jokes or showing offensive material;
- calling a person names;
- deliberately excluding a person.

CREATING A SAFE COMMUNITY

Our aim is to create an environment of understanding and co-operation. The School is committed to implementing strategies which create a safe learning and working environment and reduce, as much as possible, the incidence of harassment and discrimination. Anti-social behaviour of any kind is unacceptable in the School community.

The School provides proactive measures such as the Social and Emotional Wellbeing Survey, eCare email, Life Skills Programme, presentations and workshops, confidential surveys, active grounds supervision, peer mentoring and regular individual interviews with students by Housemasters and other Senior Staff. Students are educated to respect the rights of others to be free from harassment and discrimination.

ONLINE SAFETY

Trinity places a priority on the provision of Internet access and Information and Communication Technology (ICT) equipment. However, the School recognises that the presence in the learning environment of these technologies may also facilitate anti-social, inappropriate, and illegal material and activities. The School aims to maximise the benefits of these technologies, while at the same time minimising and managing the risks. Trinity has in place rigorous and effective school-wide cyber safety practices which are directed and guided by the School's ICT Policy.

The Information and Communication Technology Student Acceptable Use Agreement sets out the expectations that the School has for by students at School and out of School.

ONLINE HARASSMENT

Neither the Trinity Grammar School network nor the broader Internet (whether accessed on campus or off campus, either during or after School hours) may be used for the purpose of harassment.

Online harassment includes, but is not limited to: harassing, teasing, intimidating, threatening or terrorising another person by sending or posting inappropriate and hurtful email messages, instant messages, text messages, digital pictures or images, or social media posts.

What to do if you are being harassed

If you feel you are being harassed or discriminated against, there are a number of actions you can take:

- Avoid retaliating or responding
- Collect the evidence - screenshot social media posts
- Block the person who is harassing you
- Report the abuse to the social media service
- Inform the School
- If you believe it is having a seriously threatening, intimidating, harassing or humiliating effect, make a complaint on the Children's eSafety Commissioner's website.
- Consider informing the police

All reports of harassment by Trinity students will be investigated. Sanctions may include, but are not limited to, detention, suspension or expulsion. In some cases, forms of online harassment may constitute a criminal act and the School reserves the right to refer the matter to the Police or other appropriate authorities.

If you are harassed or discriminated against:

If you feel you are being harassed or discriminated against, there are a number of actions you can take:

- Tell the person to "stop."
- Avoiding a confrontation and just walking away can be effective, though ignoring continued incidents may give the impression that harassment and discrimination are accepted within the School. The School's Counselling and Psychological Service is available to help students develop the skills to be assertive in these situations.
- Do not retaliate aggressively, either physically or verbally.
- Discuss the situation with someone you are comfortable with; your parents, your Housemaster, the Chaplain, a School Psychologist or the Head or Deputy Head of School. You may also use the School's eCare email, which provides an opportunity to express concerns, and/or report incidents, which you would otherwise be reluctant to discuss in a face-to-face situation. 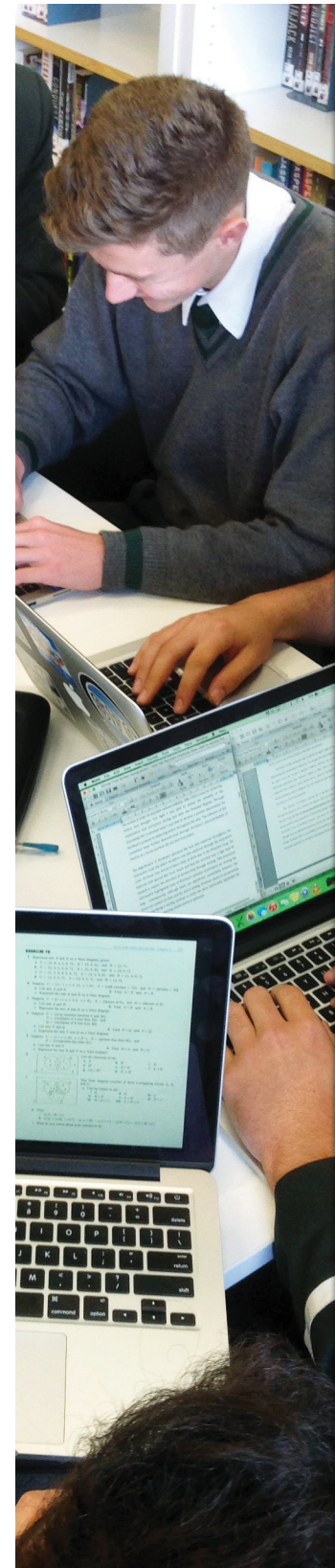
Students who observe any form of harassment or discrimination, wherever it occurs, are encouraged to report this to a member of staff as soon as possible. Harassment and discrimination can never be seen as being "just a joke" or "just mucking around." There is nothing trivial about being victimised. Parents who observe a significant change in their son's behaviour should talk to their son and a senior member of staff at the School, as such changes may be symptomatic of harassment or discrimination.

INVESTIGATION

The School will investigate all reports of harassment and discrimination in a way which affords procedural fairness to the person who is the subject of the allegation. In all cases, the School will act without bias and ensure claims of harassment and discrimination are addressed without undue delay, providing pastoral support and disciplinary action.

WORKING TOGETHER

Parents, students and the School cannot opt out of our joint responsibility in the matter of harassment and discrimination by saying "boys will be boys" as if this justifies aggressive and anti-social behaviour. We need to ensure that our students learn the right way to behave and to empower them to take a strong stand against anti-social behaviour in all its forms. Every member of the School community has the responsibility to contribute to the general welfare of the School.

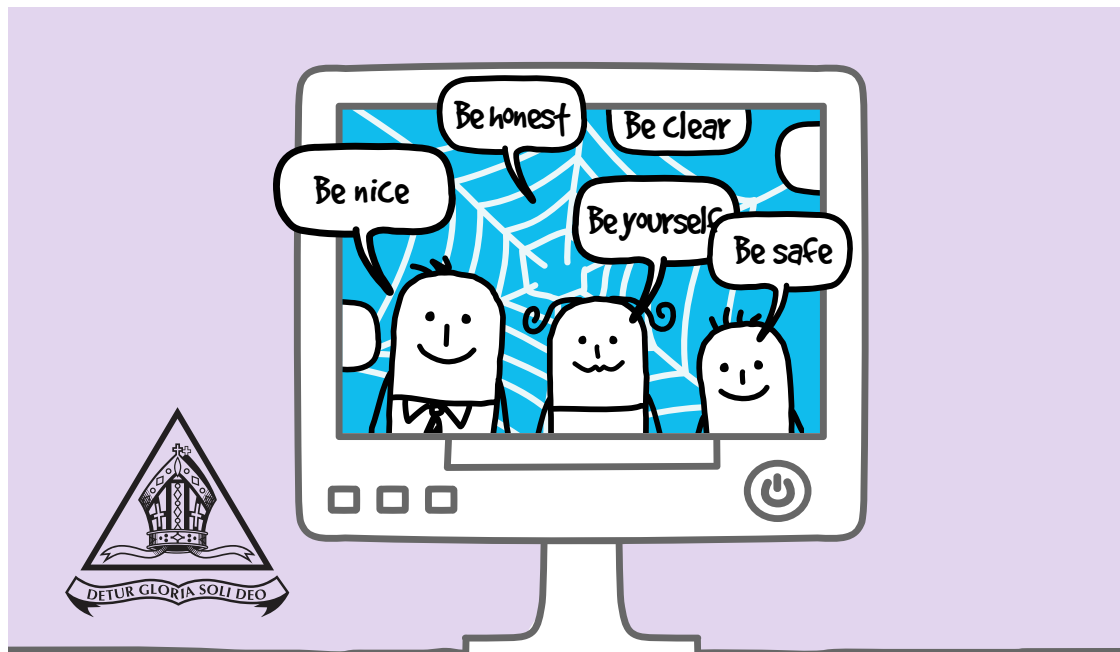

DISCIPLINE SYSTEM: PRE-K TO 12

Trinity's discipline policy and procedures are designed to be consistent across Preparatory, Junior, Middle and Senior Schools. While there are variations in different sections of the School community as a result of the different social, emotional, physical and intellectual needs of students at different stages of development, the principles and structures remain uniform. In this way, students will come to find disciplinary procedures predictable and familiar. The discipline policy and procedures are part of the broader Pastoral Policy. It involves the ways we support students at the School both proactively or reactively, like the teaching of values and positive social behaviours, and the imposition of consequences for breaches of School rules.

Although the School demands high standards of behaviour, its expectations are fundamentally reasonable. Our aim is to ensure that each and every individual within the School is given an equal opportunity to flourish and to develop his talents and skills. The discipline system is based on the principles of self-discipline and self-respect which, when responsibly exercised, promote a genuine concern for others and contribute to the development of a responsible and co-operative community. This system is built on Christian values, reflected in the rights and responsibilities outlined overleaf.

INVESTIGATION PROCESS

Staff will make decisions regarding matters of student misconduct in a manner that affords procedural fairness. In all cases, staff will act without bias and ensure that investigations occur without undue delay, providing early and effective provision of pastoral support and disciplinary action where necessary. Students may appeal a discipline decision through the Deputy Head of School, Head of School, the Deputy Head Master or the Head Master. The Head Master is the final avenue for appeal. Before a final decision is made for breaches of discipline that may result in a student being suspended or expelled from the School, the student, with the support of a parent, will be able to give an explanation of the alleged incident at a formal Disciplinary Meeting.

DISCIPLINE LEVELS

Students, parents and staff all have rights that members of the Trinity community must respect.

There are five levels of discipline. Each level provides different and/or additional consequences for the student, involvement of members of staff and communication with parents. There are minor variations in some of the details of these from campus to campus. However, the meaning of these levels remains consistent. The levels are colour coded to provide students, parents and staff with a clear indicator of the School's concern, from the lowest level (white) to the most serious (black).

LEVEL 1 (WHITE)

All students automatically commence on this level, and most remain on it throughout their time at Trinity. Students on Level 1, may be involved in a small number of relatively minor disciplinary issues from time to time. The classroom teacher and/or other members of staff usually manage these. Typical consequences may include Record Book Comments and Demerits.

LEVEL 2 (GREEN)

Placement on Level 2 indicates that the student has continued to exhibit instances of rule-breaking behaviour, despite the imposition of Level 1 consequences. Consequences increase in severity at this level. Typical examples are Detentions. Students are also monitored closely and counselled by Housemasters or Heads of School. At the Junior and Preparatory Schools, the Deputy Head and Head of School may be involved.

LEVEL 3 (AMBER)

Like traffic lights, this colour warns of the need for caution. Placement on this level reflects continued participation in Level 1 and 2 behaviours or involvement in more serious incidents, including bullying. Individual behaviour plans and student contracts may be required. Senior members of staff usually become directly involved in communication with students and parents at this level.

LEVEL 4 (RED)

The Red level requires students, parents and staff to stop, review and plan thoroughly before moving on. Placement at Level 4 indicates either continued failure to modify behaviour or involvement in incidents deemed to be serious misconduct. At this stage the Heads of School are likely to be directly involved. Consequences may include Suspension, Probation and student behaviour contracts. Parent interviews are required.

LEVEL 5 (BLACK)

This is the most serious level of discipline and the student's continued enrolment at the School is reviewed. Like other levels, this may involve repeated serious misconduct and/or serious incidences of bullying (physical and psychological), drug use, theft or extreme insubordination. The Head Master, Deputy Head Master and Head of School are involved in reviewing the student's enrolment and determining the consequences at this level.

Pre-K-12 Support Mechanisms

Students who experience ongoing behavioural difficulties will be offered support to assist them in changing their behaviour, usually through School Psychologists within the TESS Counselling and Psychological Support Services. Psychologists may also seek interviews with parents and guardians to assist in the process.

THE SCHOOL EXPRESSLY PROHIBITS THE USE OF CORPORAL PUNISHMENT AND DOES NOT EXPLICITLY OR IMPLICITLY SANCTION THE ADMINISTERING OF CORPORAL PUNISHMENT BY NON-SCHOOL PERSONS, INCLUDING PARENTS, TO ENFORCE DISCIPLINE.

SOME EXAMPLES OF DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

MIDDLE AND SENIOR SCHOOLS

Record Book Comments

These can be either positive or negative about student attitudes and behaviour or class work.

Merits

Merits are formal recognition of good class work or actions by students in Years 7-9.

Demerits

Demerits are issued to students in Years 7-9 for failure to reform their behaviour, complete required work, fulfil a minor imposition or take heed of warnings.

Detentions

Detentions are issued to students in Years 7-12 for failing to modify behaviour, complete required work or for specific breaches of their responsibilities. They may be a One-Hour Detention to be served on a week day afternoon, or a Three-Hour Detention to be served on a Saturday morning for more serious misconduct.

Suspension

For serious misconduct, a student may be issued a Suspension.

During a Suspension, the student is not permitted to attend classes, train or play with his team or attend other School activities.

Expulsion

Students are likely to be expelled from the School if they bring illicit drugs on campus and continue to engage in behaviour or serious misconduct.

Exclusion

Exclusion is the act of preventing a student's admission to a number of schools. The Head Master or his delegate may recommend to other schools that a particular student be excluded if he is a risk to the safety and wellbeing of other students or staff. The School will pass on relevant information to other schools under the provision of Chapter 16A Exchange of Information - Children & Young Persons (Care & Protection) Act 1998, so that risk assessments can be formulated by potential future schools when making enrolment decisions.

PREPARATORY AND JUNIOR SCHOOLS

Like the Middle and Senior Schools, Preparatory and Junior Schools have consequences for rule-breaking behaviours. Details of these vary in relation to the developmental stages of students, individual needs and individual circumstances. Sanctions for rule-breaking behaviours include: loss of privileges, time out/class detentions, in-class exclusion from specific activities, internal suspension from class and external suspension. Expulsion is used only when other interventions have failed or in the event of behaviour deemed to be extremely serious.

SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

DRIVING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Parents and Students must follow the directions of the School's Traffic Management plan when driving to and from school.

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR OF STUDENTS

All Trinity Grammar School students are expected to behave in a co-operative and respectful manner at all times, inside and outside the classroom, when playing sport and on excursions or camps. Students should respect each other and avoid behaviour that may lead to injury or inconvenience. Behaviour that is likely to cause harm or injury to others is not acceptable at any time. Behaviour which is disruptive, uncooperative or dangerous is likely to result in the student being given a sanction. There must be no eating or drinking inside the School buildings. This also applies to the Sports Centre and Swimming Pool.

BEHAVIOUR ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Like other Schools who have large numbers of pupils travelling by public transport, we are concerned at any reports of inconsiderate behaviour. The School's good name is brought into disrepute by such reports and an investigation will be conducted into any allegation of anti-social behaviour travelling to and from School.

- ➔ Board and leave the bus, light rail or train in an orderly manner.
- ➔ Behave appropriately and safely.
- ➔ Accept that the driver or train guard is in charge and obey his or her instructions.
- ➔ Sit properly on a seat.
- ➔ Respect bus, light rail and train property and the property of others by not marking or damaging it.
- ➔ Do not carry bags on your back when entering and exiting the bus, light rail or train.
- ➔ Place bags under the seat, near your feet or in the storage areas provided. Do not put bags on the seats.
- ➔ Have your Opal Card ready.
- ➔ Treat other travellers and public transport employees with respect.
- ➔ Show constraint, keep the noise level down and do not move around the bus, light rail or train while it is in motion.
- ➔ Do not sit when adults are standing.
- ➔ Do not obstruct the aisle, door or emergency exits.
- ➔ Do not lend your Opal Card to another student.

BEHAVIOUR WHILST ON EXCURSIONS AND AT SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

All students on excursion or at any School activity will follow the School rules set down in the School Handbook. Students are expected to co-operate and follow all reasonable instructions and behave in a safe manner to ensure their own safety, the safety of other students and the safety of staff.

BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL (MIDDLE AND SENIOR SCHOOLS)

If a student arrives at School between 7:30-8:00am or wishes to remain at School after classes have concluded (until 6:00pm) he must remain in either the Cafeteria or Library. On evenings when special functions are on at the School, students may remain in the Library until the function commences. When students are waiting to be picked up by their parents they must wait in the School car park at the designated seating area.

The Special Duties Master is on duty in the afternoon until 5:30pm and may be contacted using the phone near the Special Duties Masters' Office in Compass Courtyard. A security guard patrols the grounds from 5:00pm and on weekends.

Each Middle and Senior School student is provided with a locker and a combination lock. Students are expected to place their valuables and their bags in the locker when they arrive and to take them from their locker before leaving. Students are responsible for the security of their own belongings, including mobile phones.

PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

On School grounds, at School events, including events held by other schools where they are a guest or visitor, students must conform to the regulations of Trinity Grammar School. This includes any occasion when a student is coming to or from School or any School event, including excursions, camps, dances, sporting fixtures, performances, workshops or any other School activity. Students are not to consume alcohol, take illicit drugs, smoke tobacco or e-cigarettes (vapes) at School, travelling to and from School, at School organised activities, or as a guest or visitor at any event or activity at another school. Any student suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol at School or at any

School event, or being found to have been smoking or using an e-cigarette (vapes) whilst in the care of the School, irrespective of whether the breach has occurred off site or in transit, will be deemed to be in breach of this regulation and will be stood down until such time as an investigation is conducted and, if necessary, a formal Disciplinary Meeting is convened. Any student found to be in breach of this regulation is likely to be suspended or expelled. The use of alcohol, drugs, cigarettes and e-cigarettes (vapes) at School events is prohibited. Any student suspected of using cigarettes, e-cigarettes (vapes), alcohol or any other illicit substance at any School event will be stood down until such time as an investigation is conducted and, if necessary, a formal Disciplinary Meeting is convened. Any student found to be in breach of this regulation is likely to be expelled. Students in possession of smoking or drug paraphernalia (matches, lighters, tobacco, e-cigarettes [vapes], water pipes, bongs) will be deemed to be in breach of this regulation. Students who are suspected of bringing illicit drugs to School or to any School event, whether for personal use or for the purpose of trafficking, will be stood down until such time as an investigation is conducted and, if necessary, a formal Disciplinary Meeting is convened. Any student found to be in breach of this regulation will be expelled.

THEFT AND VANDALISM

Theft and vandalism are anti-social acts which destroy trust and creates an atmosphere of unease and uncertainty. The School will not tolerate either of these activities and will likely expel any student who steals or vandalises School property. Students in Years 7-12 must use their lockers and are not to leave valuables unsecured. Students must not bring items to School for sale. Students are likely to be expelled from the School if they are caught stealing or dealing with stolen goods.

FIREARMS AND KNIVES

The possession of real or replica firearms, cartridges, crackers or explosives of any kind is forbidden. Real or replica knives, or any other weapons are forbidden. Possession will result in the student's position in the School being reviewed with Suspension or Expulsion the likely outcome.

INSPECTION OF STUDENTS' BELONGINGS

The School reserves the right to inspect any students' bags, lockers, pencil cases, electronic devices including phones and other items belonging to a student if the School suspects that these items have been inappropriately used, contain banned or illegal substances, or are suspected of being stolen.

MOBILE PHONES

Students may have mobile phones at School for the purpose of communicating with parents in the afternoon regarding travel arrangements. Mobile phones must be switched off on arrival at School and not used during the day without the express permission and supervision of a member of staff. Students must not be seen in public wearing earphones while on their way to and from School.

Mobile phones may be prohibited from some School activities including some excursions and camps. Mobile phones not used in accordance with School rules may be confiscated.

Students in PreK-Year 6 are advised not to bring any valuables to School. Items of value that are required at School may be given to the class teacher for safe-keeping.

Students are not permitted to use head phones in classes to listen to music. There are a few exceptions:

- Senior Art students working on major works, at the direction of the Head of Visual Arts
- Senior Music students working on composition at the direction of the Head of Music
- Senior Film and Drama students working on projects at the direction of the Head of Drama
- Open High School Language students working on online courses at the direction of the Head of Languages
- Year 11 and 12 Study Hall

PHOTOGRAPHY AND AUDIO RECORDINGS

Under no circumstances may any student video, photograph or record any student or School employee during School hours or on the way to or from School without the permission of a teacher. No member of the Trinity Grammar School staff may be filmed, photographed or recorded by any student outside of School hours without the express written permission of the Trinity Grammar School employee involved.

Any unauthorised uploading of images, video or recordings of Trinity Grammar School students, Trinity Grammar School employees, Trinity Grammar School logos or emblems, or Trinity Grammar School facilities to the internet, mobile devices or social media is likely to result in a review of the offending student's enrolment.

RELATIONS WITH THE GENERAL PUBLIC

Students must show consideration for the comfort and wellbeing of the general public. They must stand back when boarding or alighting from buses, light rail and trains and allow the general public to board first. Pushing, shoving

and running in crowded areas is forbidden. No student may remain seated in a bus or train while an adult is standing.

PROPERTY

1. All property should be clearly marked with the student's name and House.
2. All damage to School property must be made good. Any damage must be reported to a Special Duties Master, teacher on duty or the Deputy Head of School. The cost of repairs is the responsibility of those who caused the damage.
3. Students must not draw on their School bags.
4. All bags must be placed in lockers (Years 7 to 12). Students will carry the books that they need to class. Bags are not to be left in the grounds.

LOCKERS (MIDDLE AND SENIOR SCHOOL)

Every student is responsible for the locker which has been allocated to him. Each locker must be kept locked using the lock provided by the School. Any student who loses his lock must report immediately to the Special Duties Master for a replacement.

Students may not visit their lockers during class or between periods.

There is to be no loitering or eating or drinking in changing rooms.

PAPERS AND OTHER LITTER

Remember the School rule that no student may walk past litter, but must pick it up and put it in a bin.

THE CHEWING OF GUM

The chewing of gum is not permitted.

ILLNESS OR INJURY

Any student taken ill or injured during the day must report to his class teacher who will then authorise him to go to the Health Centre. In the case of serious illness or injury the parents will be informed. In an emergency, students may be taken to the casualty ward of the nearest hospital by ambulance.

TUTORING, NON-SCHOOL SPORT, FAMILY COMMITMENTS AND SATURDAY JOBS

Students sometimes take it upon themselves to engage in tutoring, Non-school sport, coaching or family commitments including the acquisition of a job after school or on Saturdays. School commitments take precedence over these activities. Where special circumstances exist, for example a family commitment, parents are required to apply to the relevant Head of School for leave.



UNIFORM

Students travelling to and from School are required to wear School uniform.

SUMMER | TERMS 1 & 4

Khakis

Khaki shirt, khaki shorts, long grey socks kept up to the base of the knees, School tie, and black school shoes.

Greys

White shirt, grey trousers, black belt with a plain buckle, School tie, grey or black socks, black school shoes. The blazer is optional in summer. If the weather turns cold, students may only wear the blazer as the outer garment when in public.

Jumpers

May be worn with khakis but NOT with greys as the outer garment when outside the School.

Shoes

Black leather that can be polished. For students in Years 7-12, from the beginning of recess they may change into their sports shoes, although they must change back into their black shoes before the commencement of Period 5. Students must wear black leather shoes to Science, Design and Technology, and other classes as required.

WINTER | TERMS 2 & 3

Greys

As for summer, although the blazer is compulsory. Years Pre K-9 wear the grey blazer, Years 10, 11 and 12 the School blazer.

PreK-6

White shirt, grey shorts, School tie, long grey socks kept up to the knees and school shoes.

Jumper

May be worn outside the School with the grey uniform providing it is under the coat. It may be worn with the grey uniform inside the School without the coat. Note: The jumper can only be worn as the outer garment in public with the khaki uniform.

Travel

Students travelling to and from School must wear School uniform. Students travelling to and from sporting fixtures by public transport must wear their School tracksuit or School uniform, either khakis or greys. If travelling by car, students must wear School uniform or full School tracksuits.

School Functions

School uniform must always be worn to Trinity functions (eg drama productions, music concerts, HSC and IB major works displays, debating). School uniform must be worn to the Speech Day/Night of other schools.

Hats

Each student must have a green or white hat at School for recess and lunchtime.

Sunscreen

The School recommends sunscreen for all students.

SPORTS ATTIRE

Cricket

White shorts or flannels, white shirt, sports shoes and white socks. If caps are worn, they must be School Cricket caps.

Rugby Union

Green shorts, School jersey, School Rugby socks, garters, Rugby boots, mouthguard. School tracksuit.

Track and Field

Green shorts, School singlet, white socks, sports shoes. School tracksuit.

Swimming

Dark green trunks. Green cap with white crest. School tracksuit.

Tennis

School Tennis shirt, white Tennis shorts, white socks and sports shoes.

Basketball

School singlet, green shorts, short white socks, Basketball shoes.

Football

School Football jersey, green shorts, School Football socks, Football boots, mouthguard and shin pads. School tracksuits.

Water Polo/Diving

Dark green School trunks.

Table Tennis

School PE shirt, green or white shorts, white socks, white-soled sports shoes.

Cross Country

Green shorts, School singlet, white socks, sports shoes.

Lawn Bowls

School Lawn Bowls shirt and shorts, School tracksuit, white socks, sports shoes.

Fencing

Sports shoes, School tracksuit pants, Fencing jacket and mask.

RAW Sport

School T-shirt, green shorts, white socks, sports shoes, green trunks.

Volleyball

School Volleyball shirt, green Volleyball shorts, white socks, knee-pads, sports shoes.

PDHPE Periods, School Activity, School Gear

School PE shirt, School PE shorts, white socks, sports shoes, School tracksuit, dark green trunks.

Spectator attendance at Games

Grey trousers, black or dark grey belt, School blazer, white shirt, School tie, School socks and black shoes.

GENERAL APPEARANCE

Face

All students are required to be clean-shaven.

Jewellery

No jewellery may be worn apart from medical alert bracelets. Earnings are not permitted.

Bags

The only bags for general school use are the Trinity crested bag or backpack. Students may use the School's sports bag for sporting clothes and equipment.

Hair

Must always be clean and tidy, well brushed and combed. Haircuts may not be such as to invite comment for any reason, whether they be too long, too short, or both. Hair must be above the collar and not covering the ears. It should not be so long that it needs to be tied back to play sport. Hair must be its natural colour and not dyed.

COURTESY AT TRINITY GRAMMAR SCHOOL

A good School provides an ordered and courteous environment for all the people who are part of its community. Fundamental to this is an attitude of respect. This attitude will manifest itself in courteous behaviour and in care for the physical environment. The following principles are worth noting:

1. Adults and children should treat each other with mutual respect.
2. Good manners should be identified with strength of character.
3. Courteous behaviour and attitudes should be consistent, no matter what the circumstances or people involved.

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. At the beginning of each lesson students should remain standing to be greeted by their teacher.
2. Classes should stand to greet visitors to the room.
3. Students should defer to adults when proceeding in passages, corridors and through doors.
4. Students are expected to address adults using their title and surname, or to address men as "Sir" and women as "Ma'am".
5. If approached for help, students must conduct visitors to the School to their destination.
6. When waiting for a service to begin in the War Memorial or Preparatory School Chapel, students must remain quiet and prepare themselves in heart and mind.
7. Trinity Grammar School home teams should assume a responsibility as hosts.
8. If a formal invitation includes the letters R.S.V.P. it is essential that the person invited responds to that invitation.

It is expected that parents will assist the School in teaching good manners.

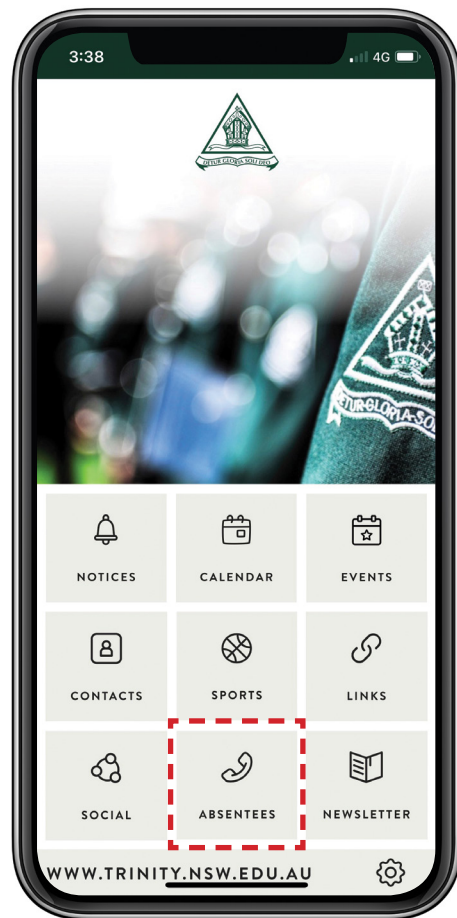


ABSENCES

WHOLE DAY ABSENCES

It is a NSW legislative requirement of the Department of Education and Training to notify the school of your son's absence/s. Parents and guardians are requested to notify the School before 8:30am, using the School App. Please complete all mandatory fields including your son's name, Year and House, (Middle and Senior Schools) or class (Junior or Preparatory Schools), the reason for his absence and the likely length of your son's absence.

- If your son's absence is unexplained, you will receive a text message notifying you. Please respond to this text with the reason for his absence.
- App forms and emails explaining your son's absence are retained on the School's database and therefore a letter explaining the absence is not required.
- Attendance on days immediately before and after examinations and assessment tasks is compulsory.

LATE ARRIVAL

Middle/Senior School students who are late to School are to report to the Student Service Office on their arrival and sign in via the Student Service terminal.

If a Junior or Preparatory School student arrives late, he is to report to the main office on arrival. Late arrivals are noted in the Record Book.

LEAVING EARLY

A student will only be permitted to sign out before the end of the school day, if the School is in receipt of a request from a parent or guardian. For Senior School students, this notification must be provided to Student Services before 8:30am.

APPLICATION FOR LEAVE

Any parent or guardian who knows in advance that their son will be absent from School for more than one day and less than five days must request leave from the Head of School.

Applications for extended leave during term time for travel, exceptional circumstances, representative sport or arts, should complete a Certificate of Exemption form a minimum of two weeks in advance.

Leave requests for greater than five days are to be directed to the Deputy Head Master - Summer Hill.

Daily devotion

These notes supplement the How to Study section. Daily devotion is often most easily placed before a time of study because in today's fast-moving world, people find it difficult to maintain a personal devotional life. It seems that the more advanced the civilisation, the more distractions exist to keep men and women from praying every day. Our devotional time must include prayer, as well as personal Bible reading in order to have divine communion with God and to strengthen that relationship with Him.

1. Set aside a period of time to praise God at the beginning of your prayer.
2. Bring your mind and spirit into a time of complete silence to the world.
3. Ask God to search your heart for any unconfessed sin and confess any specific sins you may be guilty of either against God or your fellows.
4. Examine a passage from the Gospels, the Epistles, the Psalms or Proverbs.
5. Pray for God's work around the world.
6. Make a list of specific needs you have and offer each need to God.
7. Reflect and offer specific thanksgiving for spiritual, material, physical and external blessings.
8. Select a theme for meditation and apply full attention to that specific area of spiritual thought, allowing your mind to wander within the framework of your chosen theme.
9. Take time to be silent and listen, and search Scripture for specific answers to your questions.
10. End your prayer with specific praise concerning God's greatness.

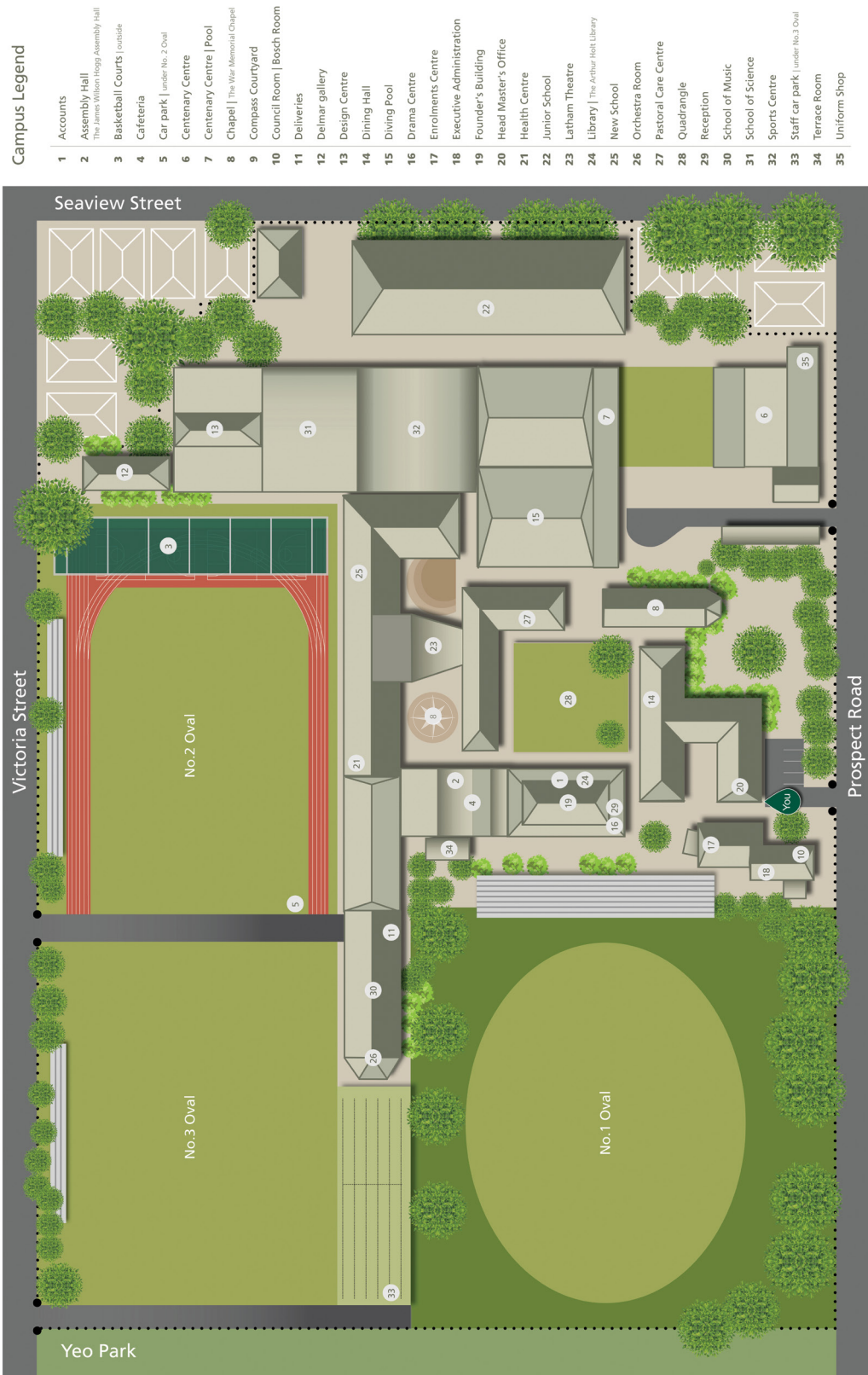

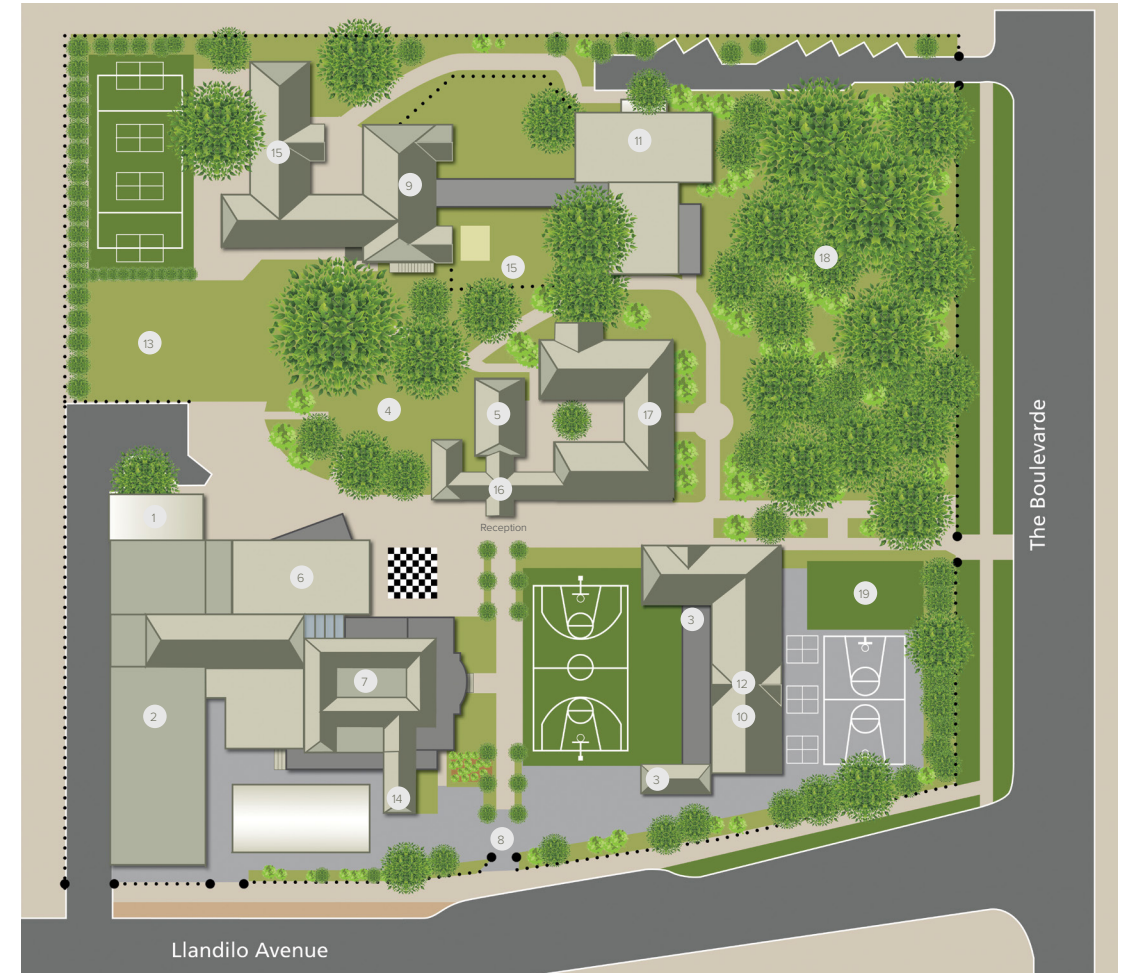

- This book is designed to help you organise your study time and use it to full advantage. In it you must keep a record of homework set and completed, and private study.
- You must have this book with you at all times when in School and must produce it when requested.
- At least once each week you must show this book to your parents for signature and any queries and comments.
- Should a member of staff wish to comment on your work, space is available for him or her to do so. You should not use this for your notes. Under normal circumstances the book will be inspected and signed by your Tutor each week.
- Remember – this is your book. Look after it carefully and keep it clean. It is not to be defaced or decorated. Report its loss immediately.
- Please refer to the end of this Record Book for an example of its weekly use.

HOW TO STUDY

READ THIS FIRST

A winning team makes its tactics and strategies go off like clockwork; they look simple. A footballer or batsman carries out actions requiring strength and co-ordination as if they came entirely naturally to him. In fact, the team and the individual sportsmen developed disciplined habits and built up skills through hard work and determination.

Just like the sportsman above we need to apply the same determination and strategies to the way we study.

Study: your full-time job

Trinity Grammar School offers you many opportunities. However your main role here is as a student, and your primary task is to learn, and being an effective student is your full-time job. The purpose of this section is to help you think about how to do your job better.

Your attitude to School

The most important quality of any successful student is his attitude to the School, his teachers and to learning. You are part of a community of learners. Your teachers are there to help you learn. At times they will have to be hard (not unfair) on you, but they have your best interests at heart.

It is the aim of all students to achieve a year's growth for a year's worth of learning, regardless of where they begin the year. You can maximise your personal learning growth over time by improving the learning behaviours we know are linked to academic success. These behaviours are defined in the Trinity Engagement Behaviours; each semester your Report provides feedback on the way you are developing in each of these areas:

Self-management

- Showing commitment to personal best effort
- Showing respect for own and others' ideas, perspectives and skills

Task management

- Using time in the classroom to organise resources, plan, begin and complete set tasks
- Using time at home to reliably complete set tasks and prepare for learning

Learning Focus

- Working with teachers and peers to participate, collaborate and meet responsibilities
- Responding to feedback and setting achievable goals

Persistence

- Embracing hard work – even when at first you are unsure
- Finding strategies to negotiate learning challenges

In other words, successful learning means managing how you feel about your learning, organising your time to complete your work, focussing on your own development rather than comparing yourself to others, and being persistent.

What is Study?

Study is engagement with learning. As a result of studying, you should know and be able to do more. Effective study should have moved you closer to achieving the outcomes of the courses you are undertaking.

Study thus comprises four related elements:

1. active participation in classroom activities and learning,
2. supplementary work undertaken at home ("homework"),
3. assessment opportunities, and
4. regular revision and consolidation.

Most students engage, at least to some extent, with the first three of these, but most really successful students also include the fourth in their weekly routines.

Help with Study

At Trinity, there are regular occasions when Housemasters, Housemasters - Middle School, TESS staff or outside organisations offer you help with how you can learn more effectively. You should avail yourself of all these opportunities.

Study Support

This service operates Monday to Thursday afternoons, from 4 pm to 6 pm, in The Arthur Holt Library. Teachers from different subject areas as well as TESS teachers are available to help you with work on assessment tasks and specific subjects, as well as organisation, developing a study timetable and other study related questions. This service is available to all students in Years 7 – 12.

Study Plus

This programme is available to Senior School students (Years 10 – 12) and enables boys to work with Academic mentors to set academic goals and receive support in different subject areas. It is an excellent strategy for Senior School students seeking to develop the regular, robust and sustained study habits required for academic success in Years 11 and 12.

The following suggestions are a simple guide to get you started. As you grow, mature and come to understand how you best learn, you will modify and adapt the following principles.

PRINCIPLES FOR EFFECTIVE STUDY

Principle 1 | Regularity

It is essential that study become a regular part of your life as a student. You should set aside regular times for work at home. Be realistic and avoid times when you know other priorities will distract you. Build balance into your life by setting aside times for relaxation and recreation but commit regular times to study at home. Construct this into a Study Timetable, and stick to it.

Principle 2 | Time

Allocate sufficient time for effective study. How much time you need to allocate to your Study Timetable will vary with each individual. The following is a rough guide only. However, if you do less than is suggested here, you should assess whether or not you really are accomplishing all that needs to be done every week.

Years 7 and 8	10 hours per week
Years 9 and 10	15 hours per week
Year 11	15-20 hours per week
Year 12	at least 20 hours per week

Principle 3 | Breadth

Ensure that every part of your academic programme receives appropriate time each week. Sometimes there will be a great deal of homework, which will take up most or all of your time. That is important and should have priority. At other times, when there is less or even no homework, you have the opportunity to work on assignments that are pending, or to revise work covered in the past.

By the end of each week, you should have:

- remained up to date with your homework;
- made suitable progress on any assignment work;
- found some time for revision; and
- ensured that every subject has received appropriate time.

If you have not succeeded in this, you should revise your Study Timetable and allocate more time.

Principle 4 | Effectiveness

You must ensure that you use your study time effectively. Ineffective study leads to frustration and wastes time. Effective study achieves goals and leaves you free to relax with a sense of accomplishment, knowing that you are up to date.

Some ways of achieving effective study include:

- taking short, regular breaks, but concentrating hard between breaks;
- setting goals for each half hour or so, and for the entire session;
- keeping your eye on the time, measuring how well you are moving towards achieving the goals you have set;
- being active – making notes, drawing diagrams, highlighting passages, posing and answering questions, saying things aloud; and
- regularly self-testing your understanding.

Apart from reading a good novel, most of us do not absorb information easily by just reading. Make notes, indicate key points, highlight key passages – otherwise you are likely to waste your time staring at a book and learning nothing.

Principle 5 | Appropriate Location

A well-lit, well-ventilated and quiet room is essential. Remove distractions. A desk or table is the best furniture to use – avoid lying down or otherwise letting your body think that it is time to relax. Try to block out noise from radio and television, and from family, and avoid having people passing through the room. Some people find that some music assists their study.

Principle 6 | Use your computer appropriately

Computers can be effective learning aids but can also subvert your attempts to study. Follow these guidelines:

- Do not play games during study time.
- Leave your email off during study time.
- Do not “surf” the internet during study time. If you need to find something, use specific terms of reference with a search engine, then get in and out quickly.
- Do not copy and paste great slabs of text. This is not only plagiarism; it also means that you have not processed the information yourself and so you have learned little or nothing.

Finally

Improving or sustaining academic grades depends upon strong engagement. You can purposefully step into the kinds of learning behaviours described here to improve your engagement, and your teachers will give you feedback on your engagement via your semester Reports.

OTHER ACADEMIC MATTERS

Students should be aware of other important places where academic information is published, including:

- The School's Assessment Policy – available at www.trinity.nsw.edu.au.
- Information on the organisation of various academic aspects of the School, published annually in the Trinity Grammar School Handbook.
- Assessment Programme booklets published annually for Years 10, 11 and 12 and assessment overviews published for students in Years 7, 8 and 9.
- Course Guides published annually for boys in Year 7 (choosing subjects for Year 8), boys in Year 8 (choosing electives for Years 9 and 10) and boys in Year 10 (choosing subjects for Year 11).

Under the Head Master, the Academic Dean has oversight of all matters of an academic nature within the School. A number of other staff have responsibility for specific areas. These are listed in the School Handbook, and neither parents nor boys should hesitate to direct their inquiries to the appropriate staff member.

BOOK WORK | YEARS 7-10

Trinity Grammar School requires that each boy in Years 7-10 diligently maintain a set of exercise books that are of the highest standard within his capabilities. It is required that books will be kept up to date at all times, and that unfinished

work will be completed as soon as possible. This is each boy's own responsibility, and should require no prompting from the teacher.

ACADEMIC HONESTY

Trinity Grammar School is committed to the principles of academic honesty, as expressed in the School's mission statement and IBO learner profile, to promote personal integrity and excellence in teaching, learning and assessment.

Students have the right to:

- Be assisted in developing personal responsibility for learning.
- Receive clear guidelines relating to academic honesty and how to use correct referencing.
- Be informed of what constitutes academic malpractice/misconduct.
- Be informed of an alleged breach of academic integrity.
- Be informed about procedures in the case of an allegation of academic malpractice/misconduct.
- Be given the opportunity to submit a written and/or oral defence and to have a parent present at investigations.

Students have a responsibility to:

- Become familiar with and follow academic honesty requirements set by the school.
- Complete the school's All My Own Work Course (modelled on the NESA All My Own Work Course)
- Not engage in behaviour that could be considered academic malpractice/misconduct.
- Make clear which words, ideas, images and works are not their own.
- Credit copied, adapted and paraphrased material.
- Make sure that information they have used is acknowledged in the body of text and is fully listed in the reference list.
- Seek assistance from teachers and/or Library Services staff in the use of correct referencing.
- Complete and sign the school's assessment cover sheet and/or the IB, IA, EE, TOK or written assignment cover sheet, declaring the work submitted is their own.

The Trinity Grammar School Assessment Policy (available on the School website) outlines the expectations for academic honesty and procedures for academic malpractice. All students and parents are expected to be aware of and adhere to this policy and its requirements.

PLAGIARISM

All sources used in an assignment require appropriate acknowledgement using a consistent referencing style. Failure to do so is plagiarism, which is stealing another person's idea(s). Plagiarism is unacceptable at Trinity Grammar School in all circumstances and results in significant penalties.

PLAGIARISM SOFTWARE

Students at Trinity Grammar School have access to plagiarism detection software to help them edit and review their work.

REFERENCING STYLES

Trinity Grammar School encourages the use of APA referencing for students in Years 7 - 10. Students in Years 11 and 12 may be advised when an alternative referencing style is required for their subject/course.

More information about plagiarism and APA referencing is available from the Library Canvas courses. Teachers and Library Services staff can assist students in the use of correct referencing and to follow the academic honesty requirements set by the School.

SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

DRIVING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Parents and Students must follow the directions of the School's Traffic Management plan when driving to and from school. Details are available on the School Website at: www.trinity.nsw.edu.au/global_docs/traffic.pdf

CLASS ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Students must attend all of their classes. Failure to do so is likely to result in a Saturday Detention being issued. Any students who leave the School's grounds without permission are likely to be suspended from School and placed on Probation. A note from parents requesting an early departure must be given to the Student Services Secretary prior to boys leaving the School.

1. Any student who arrives at School late must sign in at the Student Services Office.
2. The marking of rolls takes place at the commencement of each class.

SECURITY IN AND AROUND THE SCHOOL

If a student arrives at School early (between 7:30am -8:00am) or wishes to remain at School after classes have concluded (until 6:00pm) then students must remain in either the Cafeteria (morning) or the Library (afternoon). On evenings when special functions are occurring at the School, students may remain in the Library until the function commences. For after hours functions, students may be collected from the car park, entry via the Victoria Street gates.

A security guard patrols the grounds in the evening and on weekends.

Each Middle and Senior School student is provided with a locker and a combination lock. Boys are expected to place their valuables and their bags in the locker when they arrive and to take them from their locker before leaving. Students are responsible for the security of their own belongings including mobile phones.

CAFETERIA AND CANTEEN

The Cafeteria is used by students at Recess and Lunch, though boys in the Junior, Middle and Senior Schools may use the Cafeteria before and after School. Senior School boys may access the Cafeteria during study periods with written permission from the Head of the Senior School. If there are any queries concerning lunches or general Cafeteria/Canteen business, please feel free to come and talk to the Cafeteria/Canteen Manager, Mrs Nabiha Bitar or ring her on 9581 6069.

FLEXISCHOOLS

Trinity Grammar School has a great online ordering system for the Canteen, called FlexiSchools.

The cafeteria/canteen no longer accepts cash payments. Parents are now able to make online School Cafeteria orders up to 9am. Senior and Middle School Students (Years 7-12) may also use their Student ID Card to purchase items over the Cafeteria counter. Parents set up a Flexischools account online (see above) and pre-load their account with funds. Students can make purchases at the Cafeteria/Canteen by swiping their card at the cash register. Parents can view their son's purchases online and can set a daily spending limit on their son's card.

TEXTBOOK RENTAL PLAN

Upon receipt of textbooks, students must adhere to the following regulations:

1. Students should accept the responsibility for renting the text for one year by signing (in blue or black biro) the School stamp on the inside front cover.
2. There is to be NO writing in textbooks.
3. Students shall be charged for any textbook which has been lost, damaged or defaced.
4. Textbooks shall be collected by the School during the week after annual examinations.

CARE OF OVALS AND GRASSED AREAS

All grassed areas, apart from the main quadrangle and Head Master's lawn, may be used by groups sitting, talking and eating lunch. Energetic games are encouraged in the Sports Centre and on the Ovals. The grounds staff spend much effort and expense in keeping the School lawns and Ovals lush and green, and all grassed areas must be looked after. They must never be used as thoroughfares.

OUT OF BOUNDS AREAS

The Junior School, between the School of Science and Seaview Street, is generally out of bounds to all boys in Years 7-12 during School hours. The **Enrolment Centre** and **Reception** area is out of bounds during normal school

hours. **Hurlstone Court** is also out of bounds to boys in Years 7 to 12. Students may only be in classrooms with the express permission of a teacher.

CARS

Boys who have obtained their Driver's Licence and who wish to drive to School should complete the Application to Drive to School form available from Student Services and submit the form to the Head of the Senior School. Details of Licence Numbers and other information will be required.

As a condition of receiving permission to drive to School, boys are expected to drive in a responsible and careful manner. Boys with permission to drive to School must park in the School's car park in the GREEN ZONE. If spaces are unavailable in the School's car park, boys must park in the streets on the School's boundary and should avoid parking in Holwood Avenue and Victoria Square if possible. Boys should never exceed 40 kph when driving near the School at any time and often they should drive slower than this depending on the activity in the car park and road conditions.

If a boy wishes to travel as a passenger in a car driven by another boy, that boy's parent must complete an Application for a Student to be driven to School form which is available from Student Services. Any boy found in breach of the stated conditions will have his right to drive withdrawn. No boy is permitted to drive on School property at any time, other than the School's car park, nor is a boy permitted to visit a car during School hours.

SCHOOL DANCES

1. School dances should end no later than 11:30pm.
2. No alcohol should be served or introduced at School dances. Cigarettes are not to be brought into dances.
3. Those attending will not be allowed to leave the prescribed area of the dance and return later (i.e. no pass-out tickets).
4. Casual and group invitations should be avoided at School dances as well as at private parties.
5. Private parties after School dances should not be arranged. Parents should expect that their son and/or daughter should have returned home within a reasonable time after the close of the dance.
6. Parents should supervise transport arrangements to and from the dance.
7. Overt displays of affection (i.e. kissing and embracing) at dances should not be such as to arouse embarrassment in others.
8. School boys and their partners are not permitted to smoke at School dances. Parents who permit boys to smoke at parties (or on other occasions) make it harder for their sons to conform to School rules.

For comparison to existing hand timed records, we have adopted the International Association of Athletics Federation (IAAF) conversion standards as from 2004, i.e. 100metres, 200metres, Hurdles add +0.24 seconds; 400metres, 4x100metres Relay add +0.14 seconds. All hand times are converted to a tenth of a second and electronic times are recorded to one hundredth of a second. There is no conversion for middle distance times, except for the normal rounding up for hand timing. For example if an athlete runs 10.61 for the 100 metres hand timed, this time is converted to 10.7 (rounded up). This is then converted to the electronic time of 10.94. However, if an athlete runs 10.60 hand timed this time is converted to 10.6. Then it is converted to the electronic time of 10.84. In the 800 metres, if an athlete runs 1:56.71 hand timed, this will be recorded as 1:56.80.

N.B. In 1967 all records converted from Imperial to Metric I N.B. In 2004 all times were converted to electronic.

HISTORY OF THE JUNIOR SCHOOL

In 1945 the then Head Master, Mr James Wilson Hogg, introduced a Junior School to the Summer Hill Campus. It commenced with 35 boys in Term 3 of that year and relieved the pressure on the Preparatory Campus whose students outnumbered the secondary students at Summer Hill. The Junior School, in various arrangements of classes and with up to 78 boys continued at Summer Hill until 1956, when all the primary school boys were relocated to the Preparatory School at Strathfield.

In 2000 the Junior School was re-established by the Head Master, Mr G Milton Cujes, on the Summer Hill Campus as a gesture of good faith to the families who had been committed to the Southern Campus, a venture that remains unrealised. The Junior School recommenced with 72 Year 3 to Year 6 boys in four classes located in temporary accommodation between No.1 Oval and No.3 Oval.

In 2002 the School Council determined that the Junior School would become a permanent part of the educational profile at the Summer Hill Campus for the foreseeable future.

In 2003 the Junior School moved to permanent accommodation in the old Boarding House which was formally recommissioned in a ceremony whose guests included Messrs Neil Buckland and Neil Demeral, both of whom had been students at the Summer Hill Junior School in the 1940s.

In 2006, the Junior School commenced operation of an Infants Campus catering for Pre-School to Year 2 students on the previous St Thomas Becket Primary School site located in Thomas St, Lewisham.

During September and October 2012 the Junior School moved into a purpose-built facility on the Summer Hill Campus that incorporated K-6 Classes, with Pre-Kindergarten joining them from 2013. The new Junior School was Opened and Dedicated by The Right Reverend Robert Forsyth, Bishop of South Sydney, on 3 October 2012.

Since 2015, the Junior School has been a K-6 environment, with all Pre-Kindergarten classes operating at the Preparatory School.

UNIFORM & GENERAL APPEARANCE

During Term 1 and Term 4, Summer uniform will be worn by all Junior School boys. Winter uniforms are worn in Term 2 and Term 3.

In public, boys are to appear in full School uniform and be neatly presented, with the exception of Thursdays (Sport) for boys in Years 3 to 6 and the day/s nominated by the teacher for boys in Kindergarten to Year 2. On these days, boys must wear the full P.E. Uniform / Tracksuit.

Sanctions may be given to those boys who bring the School into disrepute by not maintaining an appropriate appearance. Boys are not allowed to eat in public when in uniform.

All clothing apparel, including shoes and headwear must be clearly labelled with the boy's name. Shoes should be polished and socks should always be pulled up.

When attending Junior School sport as a spectator, boys should wear either the School uniform or appropriate School sporting strip. Boys are expected to wear full uniform when attending all School functions, including Senior School activities.

Jewellery

No jewellery is to be worn by boys at school.

Hair

Must always be clean and tidy, well brushed and combed. Haircuts may not be such as to invite comment for any reason, whether they be too long, too short, or both. Long

strands of hair draped over shaved parts of the scalp are not acceptable, neither are very short haircuts. Undercut haircuts are not acceptable. No haircuts should be done with a cutting comb that is less than a '3' on the sides of the head and a '4' on top of the head. Hair must be above the collar and not covering the ears. Hair must be its natural colour and not dyed or set with hair gel.

Hats

All boys will be required to wear the green sun hat while playing in the grounds at recess and lunchtime and to all Summer training sessions and P.D.H.P.E. lessons. These hats are not part of the School Dress uniform and may not be worn outside the School grounds as part of the uniform.

Sports Shoes

Every boy in Years K – 6 will require a pair of appropriate sports shoes which may be left in his locker. These are to be worn at recess/lunch to play on the oval.

School Backpacks

The School Backpacks are the only acceptable type of school bag to be used. Boys must carry their School books in the backpack, swimmers and sporting gear may be carried separately in the School Sports Bag.

CANTEEN

The School Canteen is available for the use of Junior School Years K-6 boys for recess and lunch throughout the School year. It provides a varied nutritional menu with a wide selection of healthy food from which the boys can choose.

Parents are able to place a lunch order on-line each day of the week.

HOME LEARNING

At Trinity, we have a strong belief that learning occurs in and out of the classroom. This includes the learning that takes place outside of school. Accordingly, we want to acknowledge the balance of learning through playing with friends, co-curricular endeavours and family time with the importance of developing purposeful habits and a sense of personal discipline. We also want to acknowledge the busyness of family life which requires a level of flexibility.

Home learning is an expectation of students at Trinity. In assigning home learning tasks, teachers will endeavour to ensure these are:

- purposeful
- achievable
- appealing with an element of choice
- efficient (more than time consuming 'busy-work')
- include regular reading (in K-4 it is a priority to listen to your child read each night).

Home learning tasks will be varied and may include consolidating or extending learning in literacy, numeracy, the current Unit of Inquiry, music or co-curricular practice. They should be engaging and demanding but not overly onerous. We encourage parents to speak with teachers

if the balance of school and home life is presenting a challenge.

HOUSE SYSTEM

There are four houses in the Junior School – Founder's, Latham, Taubman and Young. Every boy is allocated to a specific House and competes for the House at carnivals.

CHARITY COLLECTION

Each week the boys may donate a small amount of money as part of the Charity collection. Money collected is used to provide for various charitable causes throughout the world.

SPORTS GEAR FOR PE LESSONS

All boys from Years 1 to 6 will wear the School regulation Polo shirt and shorts for all P.E. periods. Boys must wear appropriate sports shoes with non-marking soles for P.E. Lessons. (e.g. includes no fluorescent colours on shoes or laces.)

SCHOOL SPORT

All boys from Years 3-6 must participate in the Sports Programme set down for Inter-School and Intra-School fixtures. For boys in Years 4-6 these take place each Saturday morning of Term between 8.30am to 12.00pm. Boys in Year 3 are involved in an intra-school sports skills programme on Thursdays and after school on five Friday afternoons per term.

The appropriate School sporting strip is to be worn by every boy for practice sessions and official sports fixtures with other Junior Schools.

POLICY FOR THE USE OF COMPRESSION (SKINS) GARMENTS

Skins are a specific style of undergarment designed to give a physiological benefit and sport-specific functional support to athletes. Trinity understands students are interested in wearing the garments and has established the following guidelines regarding their use:

- The length of skins or undergarments must not protrude beyond the over-garment or playing/training strip (ie shorts or shirt/jersey).
- The colour of skins or undergarments must be green, white or black and no logo or advertising should be visible.

HISTORY OF THE PREPARATORY SCHOOL

Sir Philip Sydney Jones built 'Llandilo' in 1878 on a large property bounded by The Boulevard, Albyn, Kingsland and Wakeford Roads, Strathfield. He lived there until his death in 1918. The property was then subdivided and a group of Strathfield residents headed by Rev F F Wheaton, a Congregational minister, bought the house to accommodate his growing school - Strathfield Grammar School - which was then located in Albert Road, Strathfield. In 1926 Strathfield Grammar School was offered for sale and purchased by Trinity Grammar School. Strathfield Grammar School and Trinity Grammar School continued to function as separate establishments until the end of 1931, when boys from Strathfield Grammar School were incorporated into Trinity. From 1932 until 1937 classes for boys of all ages (except some science classes) took place at Strathfield, with the boarders, who resided at Summer Hill, travelling on the School bus from Summer Hill each day. The bus also transported boys to Summer Hill for sport. 1938 saw the secondary School classes relocating to Summer Hill and the Strathfield campus being established as the Preparatory School for K-6 boys.

'Lauriston', a large house on the corner of The Boulevard and Margaret Street, Strathfield, was leased by Trinity from the Vickery family in 1946 as a Preparatory School boarding house and was used during the day as the Sub-Primary school. In 1951 'Lauriston' was purchased, but by 1967 it had been sold, as a Junior boarding house was no longer required. 'Milverton' - a house closer to 'Llandilo' - had been purchased from Dr Hotton in 1966 for the Sub-Primary school. 'Milverton' could be accessed from 'Llandilo' by a right of way that ran along the rear of the neighbouring 'Somerset' property.

In 1991, following the death of Lady Joske, whose first husband, James Larcombe, had built 'Somerset' in 1923, the School was able to buy this property. Extensions to 'Milverton', opened that same year, enabled all Pre-K to Year 2 classes to be located at 'Milverton'.

A Master Plan for the Strathfield Campus led to the opening of a Sports and Music Centre in 2005, and the housing

of all Year 3-6 classes in 'Llandilo', along with a new Staff Common Room and the renovation of 'Somerset' for use as an Administration Area and Sick Bay. Further construction was completed in 2010 creating a new Library in the Common Room undercroft which was linked into 'Llandilo', and a new Multi-Purpose Classroom / Hall facility built to the east of 'Milverton'.

UNIFORM & GENERAL APPEARANCE

During Term 1 and Term 4, Summer uniform will be worn by all Preparatory School boys. Winter uniforms are worn in Term 2 and Term 3.

In public, boys are to appear in full School uniform and be neatly presented, with the exception of Thursdays (Sport) for boys in Years 3 to 6 and the day/s nominated by the teacher for boys in Kindergarten to Year 2. On these days, boys must wear the full P.E. Uniform / Tracksuit.

Sanctions may be given to those boys who bring the School into disrepute by not maintaining an appropriate appearance. Boys are not allowed to eat in public when in uniform.

All clothing apparel, including shoes and headwear, must be clearly labelled with the boy's name. Shoes should be polished and socks should always be pulled up.

When attending Preparatory School sport as a spectator, boys should wear either the School uniform or appropriate School sporting strip. Boys are expected to wear full uniform when attending all School functions, including Senior School activities.

Jewellery

No jewellery is to be worn by boys at school.

Hair

Hair will be cut well above the collar line and away from ears. The hair should not be cut in an extreme manner which invites attention. Regular inspections are made to ensure the observation of these rules concerning personal grooming and appearance.

Hats

All boys will need to wear the green hat while playing at School. These hats are not to be worn outside the School grounds as part of the normal uniform.

Runners

Every boy in Pre-K to Year 6 will require a pair of appropriate runners (e.g. not bright fluoro shoes). Please be aware that white-soled runners are needed in the Gymnasium.

School Backpacks

The School Backpacks are the only acceptable type of school bag to be used. Boys must carry their School books in the backpack; swimming shorts and sporting gear may be carried separately in the School Sports Bag. The TGS Excursion Bag is required for all excursions.

HOME LEARNING

At Trinity, we have a strong belief that learning occurs in and out of the classroom. This includes the learning that takes place outside of school. Accordingly, we want to acknowledge the balance of learning through playing with friends, co-curricular endeavours and family time, with the importance of developing purposeful habits and a sense of personal discipline. We also want to acknowledge the busyness of family life which requires a level of flexibility.

Home learning is an expectation of students at Trinity. In assigning home learning tasks, teachers will endeavour to ensure these are:

- purposeful
- achievable
- appealing with an element of choice
- efficient
- include regular reading (in K-4 it is a priority to listen to your child read each night).

From Kindergarten to Year 6, home learning will typically be set weekly. The following time allocations describe the average time students should spend doing home learning each night:

Early Stage 1	10 minutes
Stage 1	15 minutes
Stage 2	20-30 minutes
Stage 3	30-45 minutes

Weekends are usually free of home learning. However, there may be some occasions when some work is necessary.

HOUSE SYSTEM

There are four Houses within the Preparatory School - Archer, Henderson, Hilliard and School. Every boy is allocated to a specific House and in a variety of ways, and through personal endeavours, can earn points for his House. Each House will be under the direction of its own Housemaster who will be assisted by other members of the teaching staff.

MISSION AND CHARITY COMMITMENTS

The School community supports a number of Christian organisations, as well as international and local charities through whole School and House groups. These are conducted over the course of the year with families and boys encouraged to share in these on a voluntary basis.

OUT OF HOURS CARE

Before School, After School and Vacation Care Programmes are operated by OSHClub. To register for any of these programmes please visit the OSHClub information on the School's website.

SCHOOL SPORT

All boys from Years 3-6 must participate in the Sports Programme set down for Inter-School and Intra-School fixtures. For boys in Years 4-6 these take place each Saturday morning of Term between 8.00am to 12.00pm. Boys in Year 3 are involved in an intra-school sports skills programme on Thursdays and after school on five Friday afternoons per term.

The appropriate School sporting strip is to be worn by every boy for practice sessions and official sports fixtures with other Junior Schools.

POLICY FOR THE USE OF COMPRESSION (SKINS) GARMENTS

Skins are a specific style of undergarment designed to give a physiological benefit and sport-specific functional support to athletes. Trinity understands students are interested in wearing the garments and has established the following guidelines regarding their use:

- The length of skins or undergarments must not protrude beyond the over-garment or playing/training strip (ie shorts or shirt/jersey).
- The colour of skins or undergarments must be green, white or black and no logo or advertising should be visible.
- Full length skins/tights may be used for Track and Field training, however they must be green, white or black in colour and no logo or advertising should be visible.

1 | OVERVIEW

The aim of The Year 9 Field Studies Programme is to create a small community at the Woollamia Campus, in which boys have the opportunity to reflect upon the wonder of Creation and, on the threshold of manhood, focus upon and begin to clarify their view of life. This is facilitated through the provision of a unique educational opportunity for groups of students based upon academic, spiritual and physical pursuits within a remote and stimulating environment.

Why Year 9, and why a four week programme? Boys in Year 9 are independent enough to be away from home for that period of time; they are not yet too sophisticated and worldly wise to be bored, and yet they are well aware of the issues that life will present them with.

2 | ACADEMIC

There is a significant cross-curriculum focus on sustainability, utilising the local resources and environment.

Note: In addition to this, boys are expected to ensure that they keep up with their reading of normal class texts in English during their time at the Year 9 Field Studies Programme, as well as maintaining contact with their work in other courses through Canvas.

Boys will participate in an integrated PDHPE curriculum, a parallel Mathematics programme, and a number of other integrated activities in the domains of Science and Geography.

3 | PASTORAL

A key motivation in the establishment of the Year 9 Field Studies Programme is the opportunity to take boys, at a

critical stage of their adolescent development, away from the distractions of the contemporary, urban environment to think through the values that will provide their ethical and moral framework for the rest of their lives.

The boys are supported in pastoral groups and work closely with their leaders/tutors during their time at the FSC.

4 | SPIRITUAL

To be able to take small groups away for a prolonged period under the careful nurturing of Christian staff provides a unique opportunity for the boys of the School. To this end the remoteness of the site provides an essential ingredient. The spiritual programme is implemented through both formal and informal discussion, which is designed to encourage the boy to think about his relationship with God and his peers. The Christian Discovery programme consists of informal Bible Studies and weekly Chapel services.

5 | OUTDOOR EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The use of the outdoors, and particularly outdoor pursuits, is integral to the programme. Students will spend more than half their time at the Field Studies Centre involved in outdoor pursuits. The activities are not seen as an end in themselves; instead they are used as the means to implement the outcomes and goals of the programme. Students are encouraged to strive to their own level of challenge and are supported no matter what the level of their achievement.

Through activities such as a bushwalking and canoeing expeditions, mountain biking, camp craft, cooking and hygiene, navigation, orienteering, sea kayaking, fishing and surfing, the boys are challenged by the activity and by what they can take away from it. The activities are structured

with safety as the first consideration, whilst still allowing for a sense of adventure. Students are taught how to work safely in each environment and are closely supervised by professional and experienced staff at all times.

6 | COMMUNITY SERVICE

Students are able to contribute to the community by assisting in the tasks that are necessary for the upkeep of the property and daily operations. Community service is considered an essential part of the programme in the belief that service is an essential part of life.

9 | PARENTAL CONTACT

Both boys and parents are encouraged to write, at least, weekly, to each other. Boys will NOT have access to the telephones and limited access to the internet and parents are requested NOT to phone them. This is designed to

facilitate communication entirely through the postal system and allow the students, "to question the values that they have already established and come to terms with strengths and weaknesses not normally apparent in daily life."

Parents are encouraged to visit their son on Parent Visiting Day. Details about the day will be emailed to parents/guardians prior to the day.

11 | WHAT TO BRING?

BOOKS AND STATIONERY

To reduce the amount of material brought down each residential period, all textbooks for the CORE subject areas including Mathematics will be provided at the Field Studies Centre. Students will have access to school managed devices to complete curriculum based tasks.

Students must bring their PDHPE and Record Books.

Each student is given a pack of exercise and project books on arrival. Boys are responsible for their own pens, rulers, coloured pencils and calculators.

POCKET MONEY AND PERSONAL POSSESSIONS

Each boy will require a small amount of pocket money to spend on personal items. Boys will pay for their own lunch on the first and last day of the programme as well as one meal during an out trip. \$50 would be more than enough. Electronic equipment, CD players, iPads and iPods are NOT permitted during the Year 9 Field Studies Programme. Musical instruments are encouraged as long as they are not too bulky. Electronic games, DVD players, cameras, video cameras etc. of any nature are NOT ALLOWED and Mobile Phones do NOT work in the area. If brought to camp these items will be collected by staff and stored in a safe until the departure date.

CLOTHING AND LINEN

The School provides a single mattress and mattress cover. Boys MUST BRING with them their own pillow, two pillowcases, Doona and Doona cover and two sets of

single sheets. Students must wear their school tracksuit and School sun hat when travelling to and from Field Studies Centre. The boys are responsible, under supervision of staff, for their own laundry. Washers, dryers and clotheslines are provided on site. Most of the week will be spent in old casual clothes. Each student has his own small wardrobe in his dormitory but space is at a premium. Listed below is a guide to what must be brought. It can be quite cold from April to October so additional warm clothing is required during those periods.

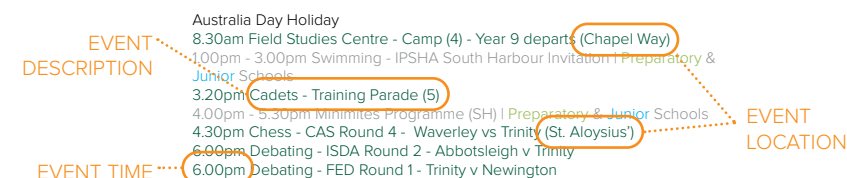
